Incoming Kindergarten Parents:

There are specific regulations set forth by the Illinois Department of Education & the Illinois Department of Public Health to ensure a healthy school life for every student. **Below is the health requirements checklist, which should be met for every student enrolling in Kindergarten:**

Kindergarten Students:

- Physical Exam-must be completed within one calendar year prior to the first day of school (dated after August
 - Lead Risk must be completed on form by physician
 - Health History must be signed by parent/guardian and verified by health provider
- Complete immunization record signed by a doctor: (5)DTap, (4)Polio, (3)Hep B, (2)MMR, (2)Varicella, (4)Pneumococcal
- Dental Exam on IL form due May 15, 2026 (dated within 18 months of May 15th deadline)
- Eye Exam on Illinois form dated within one year of the first day of school
- Birth Certificate

These documents are required by Illinois State Law. Your child will be excluded from school on October 15, 2025 until the forms have been completed and turned in or you provide a signed letter or appointment card from your doctor or dentist indicating your child has a scheduled appointment.

The necessary forms are enclosed with this letter. They can also be found on our school website at www.robinsonschools.com under the nurse's tab.
